




Notre Dame Academy has seen many changes since its founding in 2005 when it opened with a student enrollment of 162 students in grades K-8. Since then, Notre Dame Academy has built a reputation for providing a nurturing environment. In 2006, NDA's enrollment doubled, and in 2009, Notre Dame Academy became the first Catholic school in the nation to receive the International Baccalaureate's (IB) Primary Years Programme (PYP) authorization. Following a capital campaign, Notre Dame Academy began the construction of the George Student Center and Kavanaugh Hall in 2014. Responding to the demand for a Catholic high school in northern Gwinnett, the Upper School launched in 2015. Notre Dame Academy celebrated it inaugural graduation with the Class of 2019. In July of 2020, Notre Dame Academy transitioned its administration to a President-Principal Model.

Notre Dame Academy enjoys the spiritual sponsorship of the Society of Mary and the Marist community. We benefit from the ministerial presence of Fr. David Musso, S.M. our Chaplain. The commitment to the students we serve stems from a devotion to our Marist Charisms, particularly the emphasis on "saying yes to God" and His children in a willingness to both accept and learn from one another as well as through attending to learning needs. Marists priests strive to reflect the spirit of Mary by being gentle, loving, humble, inclusive, and merciful. These attributes work hand in hand with Notre Dame Academy's Mission, service program, and our IB international curriculum.

Child-Centered Liturgies, Sacramental Preparation & Service Learning Projects

The staff affirmed and expressed their faith and spirituality at the beginning of the year by a day of reflection. This reflection is focused on our vocation as Catholic school educators and our ministry.

The school's experience of prayer and worship are joyful expressions of our students' own creation of liturgical music, art and prayer. Each child, regardless of religious tradition, has the opportunity to lead and participate in prayer and worship. Our K-8 students are faith-buddies integrating younger and older students, so together the family of students participate in prayer and worship.

The school created a partnership with our Chaplain, Director of Religious Education, other local priests, our Music Minister, and students to create weekly student-focused Eucharistic celebrations. The school hosted a youth choir. Under Mrs. Pack's direction and our 2nd grade teacher, 2nd grade students were prepared for First Reconciliation and First Communion. This year, the student body celebrated a variety of liturgical services that highlight our Catholic identity including: a Multi-cultural Mass showcasing students from multiple cultures, Dia de los Muertos/All Saints Day, the Immaculate Conception, weekly celebrations hosted by a specific grade level and special events during Catholic School's week, as well as a beautiful May Crowning.

Students participated in our Living Rosary celebration and the Stations of the Cross by leading and dramatizing portions of these sacred traditions. The students also participated in many grade level community out-reach and service projects such as: Atlanta Humane Society, Ronald McDonald House Charities, Amigos for Christ, Hands of Christ: Duluth Cooperative, Catholic Charities, Canine Assistants, A Beacon of Hope, Annandale Village & Clyde's Kitchen, and Habitat for Humanity.

Notre Dame Academy was also honored to host Archbishop Hartmayer, Bishop Konzen, S.M. and Bishop Schlesinger as main celebrants for our Eucharistic celebrations.

A Variety of Learning Experiences for a Variety of Students

IB Accreditation • Highest Commendation • Full 5-Year Accreditation

Notre Dame Academy is accredited by the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools/Cognia, and Southern Association of Independent Schools. Notre Dame Academy is an authorized International Baccalaureate (IB) World School for the Primary Year Programme (PYP), the MiddleYears Programme (MYP), and the Diploma Programme (DP).

Over the course of the year, Notre Dame Academy completed a year-and-half self-study examining all aspects of our IB curriculum, instruction, related programs. An international accrediting team of IB educators conducted a site visit and awarded Notre Dame Academy with a full 5-year accreditation with the highest commendations based on the following guidelines below.

- Promoting global awareness by exploring themes that have global relevance and importance.
- Creating a culture of belonging for all learners regardless of the needs, learning styles, and differences.
- Providing the opportunity for instruction in Spanish(with the option of French), recognizing that the acquisition of more than one language enriches personal growth and helps facilitate international understanding.
- Offering a service learning curriculum that instructs students in both information and values.
- Providing technology including a laptop computer and an iPad for each teacher, an LCD projector in each class-room and Apple® devices for students in all grade levels.
- Emphasizing personal health through a physical education program and a competitive athletic program that teaches student athletes values and work ethic.
- Developing an appreciation for the fine arts and providing performance-based program for student participation.
- Providing a challenging academic program with individual instruction that tracks performance and offers opportunities for enrichment and remediation when necessary.

Living Our Mission Beyond Academics

Athletics

Our athletic year featured several noteworthy successes on the team and individual levels. We continue to grow our talent on the football field and experienced a couple of wins. Swimming excelled in the pool with both varsity teams finishing in the top ten in the state while the middle school team finished third in the state. Tennis participated in the state regional tournament. Track saw several team members qualify for the state meet. Baseball had its most successful season in school history and qualified for the state tournament for the second consecutive year. Several student athletes have been offered, or accepted, letters of intent to pursue athletics at the collegiate level.

Fine Arts

Arts continued to thrive over the course of year. Our Notre Dame Academy Symphonic baND placed 1st in 1AA Bands at Music in the Parks. In addition to their competition concert, students also participated in two band



clinics at University of North Carolina - Charlotte with Dr. Brett Penshorn and spent the day enjoying Carowinds Theme Park. Our Upper School Literary Team was awarded the GISA AAA regional championship title. Our baND also shared their talent at the Duluth Fall Festival as a main attraction in their annual parade. During Advent our K-5 music program hosted the annual Cantata and in the Spring our Evening of the Arts was a tremendous success showcasing the wonderful talent of our students throughout the grade levels.

In the classroom, on the court, on the field, or on the stage, every student at Notre Dame Academy has the opportunity to develop his or her God-given talent, share his or her gifts, and experience the spotlight of success.



Rooted in Mission

Four Years of Graduating Excellence (100% acceptance rate)

Since our first graduating class threw their caps in the air in May of 2019, NDA has continued to see our students find homes in colleges and universities across the country. Students have been accepted and matriculated to colleges in both the private and public sector. The following is representative of those colleges and universities.

In *State:* We have had students accepted and matriculated to the most competitive institutions in the state like UGA, Ga. Tech, Emory/ Emory at Oxford and many of the other local schools like Kennesaw State, Ga. State, Oglethorpe, Berry and Savannah College of Art & Design.

Regional-Southeast: Students who wanted to stay a bit closer to home, have found colleges like UNC Chapel Hill, University of Virginia, Davidson, Clemson, University of Florida and smaller schools like Wofford and Furman to draw them to their campuses.

Catholic Colleges: For some students, having a close-knit Catholic community is important. NDA has students that have been accepted and matriculated to some of the most celebrated Catholic schools in the country. University of Notre Dame, Georgetown, Villanova, Xavier of Ohio, Loyola of Chicago, Loyola of Md, Loyola of New Orleans, Marquette and Catholic University to name a few.

Colleges with a special draw/major: Students drawn to schools that offer a location or major that interest students who already have a focus on a major or future career. In Washington DC, Georgetown and George Washington have programs in politics and journalism that have drawn students to matriculate to their schools. Universities that have hospitals on or next to their campuses are also of interest to our students and have seen students find acceptances there. University of Rochester, Case Western Reserve near the Cleveland Clinic, Tufts in the Boston area are in that group. Universities that have engineering like Ga. Tech, Purdue, Clemson, Penn State and Mississippi State have accepted NDA students to their challenging programs.



Most Selective: The are an elite group of colleges that accept a very small number of students for admission, and NDA students are listed among those accepted each year. Colleges like Columbia University, Duke University, New York University, Johns Hopkins, Tufts, University of Notre Dame, Georgetown, University of North Carolina/Chapel Hill, University of Virginia and UCLA are colleges part of this group.



The success of the Notre Dame Academy is clearly a byproduct of the outstanding engagement and the generous participation of our parents in the life of the school. The School Family Organization (SFO) assists teachers with a variety activities, from field trips to class parties. This year while generating great family atmosphere, the parents hosted Trunk or Treat, Bingo Night, Appreciation Evenings, and attended multiple school-sponsored activities. 
